Dear Ladies and Gentlemen,

As Republican members of the Senate and House Elections Committees, I'm sure by now you have had a chance to read my analysis – my letter to Vice-President JD Vance about how the abuse of Early Voting and No-Excuse Absentee Ballot has led to unusually high numbers of Democrat votes being cast here in North Carolina involving election cycles since when the election laws were changed in 1999. I would like to follow up and give you some specific examples of this abuse. I want to make note of two state agencies that participate in what I call a “scheme” to get extra voters to the polls. And I would like to question the role of government in our elections, and even question the need and legitimacy of the current motor-voter laws.

One state agency that participates in getting extra voters to the polls is the NC Department of Social Services (DSS). This was called to my attention recently when I had lunch in a Henderson restaurant back in February with Jim Barrier – the Vance County GOP Chairman. Henderson is a rather small city where most people grew up with one another, and nearly everybody knows one another also. Jim and I were sitting and eating at a table when a lady came up to greet and hug Jim. I was surprised to learn that this person identified herself as not only a Democrat but also as a recently retired “social worker” presumably with the NC Department of Social Services. The conversation between the three of us soon got into the subject of “voting.” This is when Jim told his local town friend who he had grown up with that he had a list of registered Republican seniors who Social Services failed to pick up to take to the polls in the last election. Several things suddenly clicked in my head when I heard this. First, I realized that all these buses that you see pulling up to take voters to Early Voting are not necessarily paid for and organized by the Democrat Party; some are actually funded and organized by our own government, DSS as an example. And second, they are apparently playing favorites as to who they pickup and take to the polls. If you are a registered Democrat, then they make sure that you get to the polls to vote; but if you are a registered Republican, then you may get “conveniently” left behind. Another state agency that I want to make mention is the local County Board of Elections. I understand that the county boards have outreach programs where they visit the many retirement communities and assisted living facilities to help the residents to vote by Absentee Ballot. Now I'm sure that they will tell you that they administer the program equally and fairly without consideration of the person's party affiliation. That may be true, but I contend that they are targeting Democrat rich segments of the population. Since the Democrat Party and the media have many of the seniors scared to death that the Republicans are going to take their Social Security benefits away, then the majority of the elderly are likely Democrat voters. And with these outreach programs, people who would be falling off the voter rolls are held longer, much longer on the rolls.

I would like to also make mention of how some of the churches are in on the scheme to get extra voters to the polls – mainly that of the more “Liberal” churches. This story involves something that I personally witnessed back in the 2022 Midterm Elections. I and a friend, Johnny Hughes, were visiting the Unity Church of Raleigh off of Departure Drive the Sunday before Election Day (which was the following Tuesday). After the service, the people gathered to socialize and have refreshments with drink and finger-food. While my friend and I were sitting at a table to eat our food, the minister came back to the remaining congregation and made an announcement. She said that if you haven't voted yet, you could bring your ballots up to the front office and they would help you fill out your ballot and provide the two witnesses needed for the Absentee Ballot. (Apparently they had sent out an email prior to the Sunday service about bringing in an Absentee Ballot.) I believe this is inappropriate for a church to be engaged in any such activity involving our elections. I believe this particular incident was a form of “vote harvesting” and would not have taken place if we had one-day Election Day voting. People who vote Republican usually need only one day to vote – that of Election Day. But with the Democrats, they need to be given extra time, so they can go out and get some extra votes. A large segment of these extra voters include the “low-information” voter. Many are young people who have no interest in the political process; but the Democrats drag these people to the polls and tell them who to vote for. One particular category of the “low-information” voter is the mentally challenged. These people often don’t even know who they are or where they are, but the Democrats drag these people to the polls in order to get extra votes. This first came to my attention several years ago when I visited the Wilson County GOP Headquarters. One of the volunteers/employees told me of an incident where she witnessed a local Democratic candidate taking a person, who was mentally challenged, to the polls to vote and assisting that person in who to vote for. I don’t recall the name of this person in the Wilson headquarters, but Mick Rankin who is the Wilson County GOP Chairman can verify this story; and I have his email as being ●●●●●●@hotmail.com. The second time this came to my attention of getting the mentally challenged to the polls is when a friend up in Creedmoor told me a disturbing story involving the Murdoch Center in Butner, NC. This person is a highly respected local veterinarian in Creedmoor, and her name is Dr. Diana Dudley. About a year ago, she told me that when she went to go vote, she noticed a separate line at the polls for people (patients) from the Murdoch Center to vote; and people would assist these patients in telling them who to vote for. Now remember, many of these people are not aware of who they are or even where they are; but somehow they are voting in our elections. I don’t have Dr. Dudley’s phone number off hand, but her email is ●●●●●●@aol.com in order to verify this story. And getting back to Jim Barrier in Vance County, he told me at our luncheon that he actually has a video on his phone of the mentally challenged being taken to the polls in order to register extra votes for the Democrats. If we had, however, only one-day Election Day voting, these Democrats who engage in these shenanigans would be busy making sure that they themselves got to the polls to vote, instead of having all this extra time scouring the mental institutions to gather up extra votes for their party.

These are all examples of what happens when you have Early Voting and No-Excuse Absentee Ballots. And the time series analysis done by me and Dr. Stan Young is mathematical proof that there are unusually high numbers of Democrats voting since when the laws were changed in 1999. As a result, we might want to ask ourselves a few questions. One might be what should be the role of government in our elections – should they really be making sure that everyone votes? And if the government is going to be in this business, can they really do that in a fair, equal-handed, and non-partisan manner? And along this line of thinking, we might want to also revisit and re-examine the need for and legitimacy of the motor-voter laws.

I think it is appropriate for the public schools to teach children in civic classes that it is the duty of a citizen to participate in the democratic process and to become a voter. And I think it is even alright for the government to spend money advertising that “you should vote.” But I don’t think it is the appropriate role of the government to be hounding people and actually making sure you get to the polls to vote – such as rounding people up and putting them on a bus or in a van to take to the polls. Making sure everyone votes is what they do in Communist countries! I realize the intent of the motor-voter laws is to get more people to register to vote and therefore to become voters in our elections. But is this really the role of government? It is my right to vote or not to vote in an election – it’s my choice as a citizen. It is nobody’s damn business, except mine, as to if I vote or not. And I sure as hell don’t want the government to be making it public prior to and even during Election Day as to if I have voted. That information should be confidential until after the election. What in the world is wrong with you folks down there at the Legislature?

Realizing that neither side could get 100% of their disinterested people to the polls pre-2000, back then Election Day was a “game” involving a “race” to get your voters to the polls. To enhance your chances to win, you should do everything possible to try to get as many of your own people out within the confines of the full day of voting – which was the “race to the polls.” But when you now expand the time to vote, with 18 additional days of Early Voting and 60 days to get in an Absentee Ballot, you completely change the nature and characteristic of both the “game” and the “race” – you open the possibility for the results to be altered and manipulated, particularly when information is made available on who has voted and who has not. Harvesting ballots is illegal! This, however, has become replaced with harvesting voters, a busload at a time. Harvesting voters has now become the game. In the case of mailed-in ballots, repeated badgering of your voters becomes possible. Founding Fathers did not envision creating opportunities for these types of extra-personal manipulations.

You should take these things into consideration when you consider changing our election laws back to how they were prior to the changes made in 1999 here in North Carolina.
